- 2. The County of Somerset Definitive Map and Statement Long Ashton Rural District shall be modified as described in Part 1 and Part II of the Schedule and shown on the map attached to this Order.
- 3. This Order shall take effect on the date it is confirmed and may be cited as the North Somerset District Council (Upgrade of Footpath LA 18/5 and part of Footpath LA 18/4 to Bridleway Blackberry Lane Weston-In-Gordano) Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order No.3 2018.


#### Modification of part of Footpath LA 18/4 to Bridleway LA18/4

Footpath LA 18/4 commences from point A (Grid Ref: ST44453 74977) at the junction of Valley road and the un-adopted Blackberry Lane and proceeds in a south-south easterly direction for a distance of approximately 506 metres to point B (Grid Ref: ST44645 74539). This section of the route will be known as Bridleway LA18/4. The width of this bridleway will be 2 metres as depicted on OS mapping dated 1884.

#### Modification of Footpath LA 18/5 to Bridleway LA18/5

Footpath LA 18/5 commences from its junction with Footpath LA18/4 point B (Grid Ref: ST 44645 74539) and proceeds in a south westerly direction for a distance of approximately 140 metres to point C (Grid Ref: ST 44568 74428) its junction with Hill Lane. This section of the route will be known as Bridleway LA18/5. The width of this bridleway will be 2 metres as depicted on OS mapping dated 1884.

### EXPLANATORY STATEMENT THIS STATEMENT DOES NOT FORM PART OF THE ORDER

Public footpaths, bridleways and byways open to all traffic are recorded on Definitive Maps and Statements. These maps and statements provide conclusive legal evidence of the existence of public rights. North Somerset District Council is responsible for the Definitive Map and Statement and has a duty to amend them when evidence suggests that they are inaccurate or incomplete. Such amendments are made by means of modification orders made under Section 53 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981. These orders do not come into effect until confirmed; if there are any objections the Council must refer the order and objections to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, who will decide whether or not to confirm the order.

#### **Definition of a Bridleway**

A highway over which the public have a right of way on foot, on cycle and on horseback or leading a horse, with or without a right to drive animals of any description along the highway.

Two claimed routes were the subject of investigation between Blackberry Lane and Hill Lane following the submission of an application dated 25 October 2005. That application claimed that these two routes should be recorded as Byways Open to All Traffic.

Following the normal statutory procedure it was determined that the applicant's evidence did not support the routes being a byway open to all traffic. However, it was felt that the historical and user evidence had met the legal test 'that a highway shown in the map and statement as a highway of a particular description ought to be there shown as a highway of a different description'. It was therefore felt that the route A-B-C had established public rights and therefore should be recorded as a Bridleway.

North Somerset Council's Rights of Way Sub Committee considered this application on 15<sup>th</sup> November 2017 and formally resolved that the claim for a Byway Open to all Traffic be declined. However, on the grounds that there is sufficient evidence that Bridleway rights may have been established that an order should be made for the claimed route A-B-C.

The report that was considered by the Committee is available on the Council's website, please note that these have been broken down due to the size of the report and therefore consists of **Report 6 through to Report 6.2**.

The route A-B-C commences at the junction of Valley Road and the un-adopted Blackberry Lane and proceeds in a south-south easterly direction for a distance of approximately 506 metres to Point B. This section of the route will be known as Bridleway LA18/4. The route then continues from the junction at point B and proceeds in a south westerly direction for a distance of approximately 140 metres to Point C to its junction with

Hill Lane. This section of the route will be known as Bridleway LA18/5. This route is shown on the attached Order map EB/Mod34.

To be relevant, objections or representations should relate to the question as to whether this is a historically used route; other objections or representations (e.g. relating to privacy, security, suitability, desirability or amenity) may be held to be irrelevant.

The right of objection to an order is a statutory right, but it should be exercised in a reasonable manner. It should be noted that all comments received will form part of the case for this Order and if necessary will be forwarded to the Planning Inspectorate and interested parties.

If there are no objections to the order, or if any made are duly withdrawn, the authority may confirm the order, and the Definitive Map and Statement will then be modified. If there are any objections which are not withdrawn, then North Somerset District Council must refer the order and objections to the Planning Inspectorate acting for the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs. The Department will appoint an independent Inspector to consider the order and hear the objections, normally by holding a local Public Inquiry. The Inspector may confirm the order, with or without modifications, or may decide that the order should not be confirmed.

Footpath LA 18/4 commences from point A (Grid Ref: ST44453 74977) at the junction of Valley road and the un-adopted Blackberry Lane and proceeds in a south-south easterly direction for a distance of approximately 506 metres to point B (Grid Ref: ST44645 74539). This section of the route will be known as Bridleway LA18/4.

Footpath LA 18/5 commences from its junction with Footpath LA18/4 point B (Grid Ref: ST 44645 74539) and proceeds in a south westerly direction for a distance of approximately 140 metres to point C (Grid Ref: ST 44568 74428) its junction with Hill Lane. This section of the route will be known as Bridleway LA18/5.

If no representations or objections are duly made to the Order, or to any part of it, or if any so made are withdrawn, North Somerset Council, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State (or part of it if the authority has by notice to the Secretary of State so elected under paragraph 5 of Schedule 15 to the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981) may itself confirm the Order (or that part of the Order). If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment, in whole or in part, any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent with it.
