NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on the 17th August 2018 North Somerset Council made the following Order under Sections 81, 82(2), 83(2), 84(1) and (2) of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended (hereinafter referred to as “the Act of 1984”) and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, the effect of which will be:

1. Restrict any vehicle from exceeding **20 miles per hour** on lengths of the roads specified in Schedule 1 to this Notice
2. Restrict any vehicle from exceeding **30 miles per hour** on lengths of the roads specified in Schedule 2 to this Notice
3. Restrict any vehicle from exceeding **40 miles per hour** on lengths of the roads specified in Schedule 3 to this Notice

The Order will come into operation on the 31st August 2018 and copies of this together with a map and a copy of the Council's statement of reasons for making the orders may be inspected at:

Any person who desires to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in the order on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, or on the grounds that any of the relevant requirements of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the order, may within six weeks after the date on which the order was made, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

The Council of North Somerset (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”) in exercise of its powers under Sections 81, 82, 83 and 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended (hereinafter referred to as “the Act of 1984”) and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 31st August 2018 and may be cited as the North Somerset Council (Flax Bourton) (Various Roads) (20mph speed limit) (30mph speed limit) (40mph Speed limit) Order 2018.
2. No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 20 miles per hour on the lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 of this Order.
3. No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour on the lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 of this Order.
4. No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour on the lengths of road specified in Schedule 3 of this Order.
5. No speed limit imposed by this order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3 (4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations when used in accordance with regulation 3 (5) of those regulations.
6. The County of Somerset (Flax Bourton, Various Roads, district of Woodspring) (Restricted Roads) (De-Restriction) Order 1961 is hereby revoked
