

Transfer to Primary School - September 2019 Allocation Sheet for Wraxall C of E Primary School



National offer day (16 April 2019)

Wraxall C of E Primary School has an admission number of 15.

51 preferences have been received for the school. It has, therefore been necessary to use the oversubscription criteria, as outlined below, to determine which of the applicants should be offered the places available.

The 15 available places have been offered to the following applicants:

Where a school is named in a child's Statement of Special Educational Needs or Education Health and Care Plan, the admission authority is legally required to admit the child to the school. Therefore, such children are allocated places before the admissions criteria, detailed below, are applied.

The distance between home and school for the last child offered a place was 1.634 miles.
