52 applications have been received for the school. The school has an Admission Number of 30. Information about the school's admission arrangements is included in the book 'Starting School ~ a guide for parents'. It has not been possible to meet all the requests for places and it has been necessary to use the oversubscription criteria, as described in the parent's guide and outlined below, to determine which of the applicants should be offered the places available.

Where a school is named in a child's Statement of Special Educational Needs or Education, Health and Care (EHC) plan, the admission authority is legally required to admit the child to the school. Therefore such children are allocated places before the criteria are applied.

The school was established to serve the Parishes of Corpus Christi, Our Lady of Lourdes and St. Joseph's, Weston-super-Mare and Our Lady Queen of the Apostles, Cheddar.

The 30 available places have been offered as follows:

The school is named in a Statement of Special Educational Needs or EHC plan ~ 0 children;

- 1 Baptised Catholic children in Care at the time of application and Baptised Catholic children who were previously in Care but ceased to be so because they were adopted (or became subject to a child arrangements order or special guardianship order) immediately following having been in Care ~ 0 children;
- 2 Baptised Catholic children and who live within one of the Parishes named above who will have a brother or sister attending the school at the time of admission ~ 3 children;
- 3 Baptised Catholic children who live within one of the Parishes named above ~ 9 children;
- 4 Baptised Catholic children who live outside the Parishes named above and who will have a brother or sister attending the school at the time of admission ~ 0 children;
- 5 Baptised Catholic children who live outside the parishes named above ~ 0 children;
- 6 Children in Care at the time of application and children who were previously in Care but ceased to be so because they were adopted (or became subject to a child arrangements order or special guardianship order) immediately following having been in Care who are not Baptised Catholic ~ 0 children;

- 7 Children of a Baptised Catholic parent who live within one of the named Parishes ~ 0 children;
- 8 Children who will have a brother or sister attending the school at the time of admission ~ 7 children;
- 9 Children who do not fall into any of the above categories ~ 11 children.

To admit another child to the school would cause prejudice to the provision of efficient education or the efficient use of resources by reason of 'relevant measures', i.e. measures that would be required to be taken, in order to ensure that the legal limit on class sizes of one teacher per 30 children is met at the school. Any appeals for places at the school are therefore 'infant class size prejudice cases'.
