Allocation Sheet for Mendip Green Primary School

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Mendip Green Primary School has an Admission Number of 90. 191 applications have been received for the school. It has, therefore been necessary to use the oversubscription criteria, as outlined below, to determine which of the applicants should be offered the places available.

The 90 available places have been offered to the following applicants:

Where a school is named in a child's Statement of Special Educational Needs Education or Health and Care Plan, the admission authority is legally required to admit the child to the school. Therefore such children are allocated places before the criteria, detailed below, are applied.

iii	Children, where it is the nearest school to their home address, who live more than a distance of 2 miles from that school measured by the shortest available walking route.	0 children
iv	Children living nearest to the school.	49 children

The distance between home and school for the last child offered a place was 1.241 miles.
