St Anne's C of E Primary School has an Admission Number of 60. 113 applications have been received for the school. It has, therefore been necessary to use the oversubscription criteria, as outlined below, to determine which of the applicants should be offered the places available.

The distance between home and school for the last child offered a place was 0.409 miles.

To admit another child to the school would cause prejudice to the provision of efficient education or the efficient use of resources by reason of 'relevant measures', i.e. measures that would be required to be taken in order to ensure that the legal limit on class sizes of one teacher per 30 children is met at the school. Any appeals for places at the school are therefore 'infant class size prejudice cases'.

Site allocation

Admission to St Anne's VA Primary School is to the school only and not to any particular site. A separate site allocation process has been completed to decide which site is allocated to each child as per the school's admission arrangements for 2018-19.

Parents were asked to complete a Supplementary Information Form to state which of the St Anne's sites they wish their child to attend.

West Wick site
