School Admissions Team
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Winford C of E Primary School has an Admission Number of 30. 39 applications have been received for the school. It has, therefore been necessary to use the oversubscription criteria, as outlined below, to determine which of the applicants should be offered the places available.

The 30 available places have been offered to the following applicants:
