Worle Village Primary School has an Admission Number of 60. 62 applications have been received for the school.

15 preferences were offered a place. The remaining 15 places were offered to pupils that were unable to gain a place at one of their preference schools.

Update on 4th June 2018

5 places became available due to parents not accepting the offer of a place.
5 applications were considered for the 5 vacancies.

The place was allocated in accordance with the oversubscription criteria as follows:

	The school is named in a Statement of Special Educational Needs or Education Health and Care Plan.	0 children
i	Children in Care at the time of application and children who were previously in Care but ceased to be so because they were adopted (or became subject to a child arrangements order or special guardianship order) immediately following having been in Care.	0 children
ii	Children with a brother or sister who will be attending the school at the time of admission	1 child
iii	Children, where it is the nearest school to their home address, who live more than a distance of 2 miles from that school measured by the shortest available walking route.	0 children
iv	Children living nearest to the school.	4 children

The distance between home and school for the last child offered a place was 110.412 miles.
