PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER NO. 1 2016

This Order is made by North Somerset District Council ("the authority") under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 ("the 1980 Act") because it appears to the authority that in the interests of the owners of the land crossed by the footpaths described in paragraph 1 of the order and of the public it is expedient that the lines of the paths should be diverted.

The applicants, North Somerset Council, have agreed to defray any compensation which becomes payable in consequence of the coming into force of this order and any expenses which are incurred in bringing the new site of the paths into a fit condition for use by the public.

BY THIS ORDER:

- 1 The public rights of way over the land situated between Ebdon Lane Wick St Lawrence and Bourton Lane St Georges and shown by a bold continuous line on the Map No. PPO 163 contained in this order and described in Part 1 of the Schedule to this order shall be stopped up on the date on which North Somerset District Council certify that work has been carried out to bring the site of the new highways mentioned in Part 2 of the Schedule into a fit condition for use by the public.
- 2. Notwithstanding this order Western Power Distribution and Open Reach BT shall have the following rights over the land referred to in paragraph 1 namely: they shall for the purpose of carrying out their undertaking continue to have the same rights in respect of their apparatus as they had immediately before the date on which the footpaths are diverted.
- 3. There shall at the end of 28 days from the date of confirmation of this order be public footpaths over the land situated between Ebdon Lane Wick St Lawrence and Bourton Lane St Georges described in Part 2 of the Schedule and shown by bold broken lines on the Map No. PPO 163 attached to this order.
- 4. The rights conferred on the public under this order shall be subject to the limitations and conditions set out in Part 3 of the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

PART 1

DESCRIPTION OF SITE OF EXISTING PATHS OR WAYS

That part of footpath AX28/24 in the Parish of Wick St Lawrence from point C₁ (grid reference ST36889 63983) running in a general easterly direction to G₂ via point K₁ (grid reference ST37058 63993), point W (grid reference ST37234 64010), point I (grid reference ST37435 64099), point M₁ (grid reference ST37674 64133), point G₁ (grid reference ST37729 64147) and point G₂ (grid reference ST37766 64177) a distance of approximately 900 metres as shown by a bold continuous line on Map no. PPO 163.

That part of footpath AX28/23 in the Parish of Wick St Lawrence from point B_1 (grid reference ST36992 64326) in a southerly direction to D_1 (grid reference ST37091 63951) via point K_1 (grid reference ST37058 63993) and K_2 (grid reference ST37071 63971) a distance of approximately 410 metres as shown by a bold continuous line on Map no. PPO 163.

That part of footpath AX28/27 in the Parish of Wick St Lawrence from point G₁ (grid reference ST37729 64147) in a south westerly direction to H₂ (grid reference ST37613 63775) a distance of approximately 440 metres as shown by a bold continuous line on Map no. PPO 163.

That part of footpath AX3/41 in the Parish of St Georges from point H_2 (grid reference ST37613 63775) running in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 450 metres to point H_1 (grid reference ST37623 63323) as shown by a bold continuous line on Map no. PPO 163.

That part of footpath AX3/40 in the Parish of St Georges from point D_2 (grid reference ST37105 63933) running in a north westerly direction for a distance of approximately 20 metres to point D_1 (grid reference ST37091 63951) as shown by a bold continuous line on Map no. PPO 163.

PART 2

DESCRIPTION OF SITE OF NEW PATHS OR WAYS

A footpath running from point C_1 (grid reference ST36889 63983) on the east side of the River Banwell to point G_2 (grid reference ST37766 64177) via point Q (grid reference ST36978 63959), point L (grid reference ST37050 63971), point K_2 (grid reference ST37071 63971), point P_2 (grid reference ST37102 63954), point J (grid reference ST37240 63995), point I (grid reference ST37435 64099), point T_3 (grid reference ST37572 64048), point M_1 (grid reference ST37674 64133), point M_2 (grid reference ST37719 64156) to point G_2 (grid reference ST37766 64177) a distance of approximately 970 metres as shown by a bold broken line on Map no. PPO 163. The alternative route for Footpath AX28/24 will have a made up surface 5m wide path between point C_2 and P_2 . From P_2 through to G_2 the route will continue as an unmade surfaced 2m wide path.

A footpath running from point B₂ (grid reference ST36992 64326) in a south westerly, then south easterly direction to point L (grid reference ST37050 63971) via point Z (grid reference ST36944 64269), point N (grid reference ST37022 64062) to point L (grid reference ST37050 63971) a distance of approximately 470

metres as shown by a bold broken line on Map no. PPO 163. The alternative route for Footpath AX28/23 will have a made up surface 3m wide path between point B₂ and L.

A footpath running from point T_3 (grid reference ST37572 64048) the proposed alternative route for AX28/24 to join the existing public right of way AX3/40 at point E (grid reference ST37437 63517) via point T_2 (grid reference ST37565 64041), point T_1 (grid reference ST37594 63883), point O_2 (grid reference ST37502 63836), point O_1 (grid reference ST37469 63795) to point E (grid reference ST 37437 63517) a distance of approximately 671 metres as shown by a bold broken line on Map no. PPO 163. The alternative route for Footpath AX28/27 and Footpath AX3/41 will have an unmade surfaced 2m wide path between T_2 and O_1 , which will then continue as a 3m wide made up surfaced path to point E.


A footpath running from point D_2 (grid Reference ST37105 63933), north end of AX3/40 to meet proposed new route AX28/24 at point P_2 (grid reference ST37102 63954) via P_1 (grid reference ST37105 63945) a distance of approximately 20 metres as shown by a bold broken line on Map no PPO 163. The alternative route for Footpath AX3/40 between points D_2 and P_2 will be a 5m wide made up surfaced path.

The above Order, made on 26th May 2016, under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980, will divert Public Footpath AX28/27, AX28/24 and AX28/23 in the Parish of Wick St Lawrence and Footpath AX3/41 and part of Footpath AX3/40 in the Parish of St Georges within the District of North Somerset as described below.

Please note grid references are bracketed in the following paragraphs:

Footpath AX28/24

That part of footpath AX28/24 in the Parish of Wick St Lawrence from point C_1 (ST36889 63983) running in a general easterly direction to G_2 via point K_1 (ST37058 63993), point W (ST37234 64010), point I (ST37435 64099), point M_1 (ST37674 64133), point G_2 (ST37766 64177) a distance of approximately 900 metres as shown by a bold continuous line on Map no. PPO 163.

To a footpath running from point C₁ (ST36889 63983) on the east side of the River Banwell to point G₂ (ST37766 64177) via point Q (ST36978 63959), point L (ST37050 63971), point K₂ (ST37071 63971), point P₂ (ST37102 63954), point J (ST37240 63995), point I (ST37435 64099), point T₃ (ST37572 64048), point M₁ (ST37674 64133), point M₂ (ST37719 64156) to point G₂ (ST37766 64177) a distance of approximately 970 metres as shown by a bold broken line on Map no. PPO 163. The alternative route for Footpath AX28/24 will have a made up surface 5m wide path between point C₂ and P₂. From P₂ through to G₂ the route will continue as an unmade surfaced 2m wide path.

Footpath AX28/23

That part of footpath AX28/23 in the Parish of Wick St Lawrence from point B₁ (ST36992 64326) in a southerly direction to D₁ (ST37091 63951) via point K₁ (ST37058 63993) and K₂ (ST37071 63971) a distance of approximately 410 metres as shown by a bold continuous line on Map no. PPO 163.

To a footpath running from point B_2 (ST36992 64326) in a south westerly, then south easterly direction to point L (ST37050 63971) via point Z (ST36944 64269), point N (ST37022 64062) to point L (ST37050 63971) a distance of approximately 470 metres as shown by a bold broken line on Map no. PPO 163. The alternative route for Footpath AX28/23 will have a made up surface 3m wide path between point B_2 and L.

Footpath AX28/27 and Footpath AX3/41

That part of footpath AX28/27 in the Parish of Wick St Lawrence from point G_1 (ST37729 64147) in a south westerly direction to H_2 (ST37613 63775) a distance of approximately 440 metres as shown by a bold continuous line on Map no. PPO 163 and that part of footpath AX3/41 in the Parish of St Georges from point H_2 (ST37613 63775) running in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 450 metres to point H_1 (ST37623 63323) as shown by a bold continuous line on Map no. PPO 163.

To a footpath running from point T_3 (ST37572 64048) the proposed alternative route for AX28/24 to join the existing public right of way AX3/40 at point E (ST37437 63517) via point T_2 (ST37565 64041), point T_1 (ST37594 63883), point T_2 (ST37502 63836), point T_3 (ST37469 63795) to point E (ST 37437 63517) a distance of approximately 671 metres as shown by a bold broken line on Map no. PPO 163. The alternative route for Footpath AX28/27 and Footpath AX3/41 will have an unmade surfaced 2m wide path between T_2 and T_2 01, which will then continue as a 3m wide made up surfaced path to point E.

Footpath AX3/40

That part of footpath AX3/40 in the Parish of St Georges from point D₂ (ST37105 63933) running in a north westerly direction for a distance of approximately 20 metres to point D₁ (ST37091 63951) as shown by a bold continuous line on Map no. PPO 163.

To a footpath running from point D_2 (ST37105 63933), north end of AX3/40 to meet proposed new route AX28/24 at point P_2 (ST37102 63954) via P_1 (ST37105 63945) a distance of approximately 20 metres as shown by a bold broken line on Map no PPO 163. The alternative route for Footpath AX3/40 between points D_2 and P_2 will be a 5m wide made up surfaced path.

Please state the grounds on which they are made.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, North Somerset District Council may confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, any representations and objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the Order.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER NO. 1 2016

THIS STATEMENT IS FOR INFORMATION ONLY AND DOES NOT FORM PART OF THE ORDER

Under the provisions of S.119 of the Highways Act 1980 County and District Councils have the power to make orders to divert public rights of way. A notice that such an order has been made has to be advertised on the site of the path in question and in the local press. This provides an opportunity for objections or representations to be made to the proposed change.

North Somerset District Council ("the Council") has made this Order because it appears to the authority that in the interests of the landowners and of the public it is expedient that the lines of the paths should be diverted.

In the main, these paths are on land forming part of the strategic flood alleviation works for "Weston Villages" development, an area which may become flooded in times of extreme weather. Under planning development (14/P/2206/F2) a number of fields have been excavated for water storage in times of heavy rainfall. Some sections of the existing rights of way could, at times, become flooded therefore it is necessary to divert the existing rights of way onto prepared, easy access paths suitable for less able walkers thereby improving the quality and condition of these frequently used footpaths in an area close to the conurbation.

Paths AX3/41, AX28/27 and a section of AX28/24 fall outside of the flood alleviation scheme but it is felt that these routes should be rationalised so as to provide better links to the paths affected by the flood alleviation works to the west.

The proposed diversions will benefit the public by aligning the public rights of way onto easily accessible paths with clear, unambiguous routes continuing through to Ebdon and Bourton Lanes. The landowner will also benefit as the proposed new routes should reduce trespass and free up sections of land crossed by public rights of way for agricultural use.

The application complies with the provisions of Section 119 (1) of the Highways Act 1980 on the basis that, in the interests of the owners of the land crossed by the paths or ways and of the public it is expedient that the line of the paths or ways or part of that line should be diverted. It further complies with Section 119 (6) in that the paths or ways will not be substantially less convenient to the public in consequence of the diversion.

The order will come into effect only after it has been confirmed. Making and advertising the Order simply provides an opportunity for objections or representations to be made.

Any representations about or objections to the order must be made in writing by 30th June 2016 to the Director of Development and Environment, Natural Environment Team, Streets and Open Spaces, Town Hall, Walliscote Grove Road, Weston-super-Mare, BS23 1UJ quoting reference PAP/PPO 163 and stating the grounds on which they are made.

If any objections are made and not withdrawn the matter will be referred to the Council's Public Rights of Way Sub-Committee who will decide whether or not to submit the Order to the Planning Inspectorate (as agent for the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs) for determination. Once submitted, the Planning Inspectorate will then appoint an Inspector who will determine whether to deal with the matter by written representations, a hearing or a public inquiry. The inspector can confirm an Order, confirm it with modifications, or refuse to confirm it. In some cases the Inspectorate may award costs against objectors. If no objections are received the Council will be able to confirm the Order itself but has no powers to modify Orders.

The right of objection to an Order is a statutory right, but it should be exercised in a reasonable manner. If you objected at the pre-order stage and still wish to object now that the Order has been made you will need to re-submit your objection by the deadline specified above. Only objections received during this statutory period will be forwarded to the Secretary of State.
