

NOTICE OF INTENT

NORTH SOMERSET DISTRICT COUNCIL

CONSTRUCTION OF A RAISED TABLE AND SPEED CUSHIONS ON OXFORD STREET, WESTON-SUPER-MARE

1. Notice is hereby given that North Somerset District Council in exercise of the powers conferred by section 90A of the Highways Act 1980 (hereinafter called 'the Act') and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with section 90C (1) of the Act and those bodies or persons prescribed by the Highways (Road Humps) Regulations 1999 (hereinafter called 'the Regulations') and in accordance with section 90C (2) of the Act intends to construct road humps at the locations specified in the Schedule to this Notice.
2. **The general effect of the notice will be to construct a raised table and speed cushions on Oxford Street** at the following locations:
 - Two speed cushions outside/near no.3/5 Oxford Street, grid ref: 331848,161228
 - Two speed cushions outside/near no.53 Oxford Street, grid ref: 332046,161242
 - One raised table from approx. 8m east of no.15 (grid ref: 331896,161231) in an easterly direction to no.41 (grid ref: 332006,161240) Oxford Street approx. 110m in length, that will protrude into St James Street and High Street by approx. 10m.

The speed cushions measurements will be 2.0m long by 1.8m wide and no more than 75mm in height, subject to the permitted tolerances.

The raised table will be full road width and no more than 75mm in height, subject to the permitted tolerances.
