

Transfer to Secondary School - September 2021

Allocation Sheet for Winterstoke Hundred Academy

National Offer Day (16 April 2021)

Winterstoke Hundred Academy has a Published Admission Number of 150.

306 preferences have been received for the school.

After calculating preferences for all schools in North Somerset 138 children were offered Winterstoke Hundred Academy. Five children were offered a place as referrals. No children were refused a place therefore the oversubscription criteria was not needed. This left seven spaces.

Update on 26th April 2021

10 places were available in the second round of allocations due to three parents not accepting the offer of a place.

15 preferences have been received for the school. It has, therefore been necessary to use the oversubscription criteria, as outlined below, to determine which of the applicants should be offered the places available.

The 10 available places have been offered to the following applicants:

Where a school is named in a child's Statement of Special Educational Needs or Education Health and Care Plan, the admission authority is legally required to admit the child to the school. Therefore such children are allocated places before the admissions criteria, detailed below, are applied.

The distance between home and school for the last child offered a place was 2.027 miles.

Any applicants not offered a place at the school have been refused because, under the terms of the School Standards Framework Act 1998 (as amended by the Education Act 2011), a place may be refused if the admission of an additional child would cause prejudice to the provision of efficient education or the efficient use of resources.
