For your safety you can detach this bit of the leaflet so that you are left with a list of telephone numbers on various subjects.

Protect yourself and only call when safe to do so, a call to some agencies may arouse less suspicion than others.

It's worth thinking now about what you might need if you have to leave in a hurry:

- keep this card handy where it won't be found
- if safe, put the following away or leave with a friend: paperwork (birth certificates, benefit books etc), cash, clothes, toiletries, keys
- think about transport to get away
- arrange a signal with a friend so they know when you are going
- dont forget your childrens favourite toys.

If it is not safe to hide things away at least think about where the things you need are and how you could collect them in order to leave quickly.

But remember that the most important thing is that you and your family are safe. You can always replace possessions.
