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Staying in Education & Training after Year 11

All young people are required to stay in education, employment, or training until their 18th birthday. This is so that every young person gains the right knowledge and skills to move on to a successful career.

What are my options?

You can choose from:

- 1 | staying in full-time education at school or college
- 2| starting an apprenticeship or traineeship
- 3 | spending 20 hours or more a week working or volunteering while in part-time education or training

The pathway you choose will be based on what GCSE grades you achieve, how you like to learn and what you want to do in the future. If you do not achieve a Grade 4 in Maths and/or English GCSE then you will need to continue studying these subjects at a school, college, or training provider.

Getting Support

If you are still at school, you should meet with your Careers Adviser who will provide you with impartial advice and guidance about all the post-16 options in your local area. You can also speak with your tutors and other staff in school who know you well. They will help to advise you about the options that fit best with your abilities and interests.

GCSE Current Grading Structure 2021-2022

What are the old equivalents of new GCSE grades?

Ahead of the 2017 GCSEs, the Government changed the GCSE grading system from:

A* to G, to a numerical system of 9 to 1 (9 being the top grade and 1 being the lowest).

As per the guide below, issued by the exams regulator Ofqual, the numerical system essentially works like this:

- 9 = High A* grade
- 8 = Lower A* or high A
- 7 = Lower A grade
- 6 = High B grade
- 5 = Lower B or high C also known as a Strong Pass
- 4 = Lower C grade also known as a Standard Pass
- 3 = D or high E
- 2 = Lower E or high F
- 1 = Lower F or G
- U = U remains the same

Qualification Levels

Entry Level

If you don't have any qualifications this is the place to start.

What courses can I do?

Foundation Learning or Traineeship

Level 1 | This is a good place to start if you are new to a subject and would like to improve your basic knowledge. You will need to have achieved GCSE grades 1 to 3 and show a willingness to learn.

What courses can I do?

Diploma Level 1, NVQ Level 1 or Traineeship

Level 2| As well as knowledge or experience of your subject, you'll also need four GCSEs at grades 1 to 4 or a Level 1 qualification. Some apprenticeships could have different entry criteria, and some Level 2 courses might require you to have an English and Maths GCSE at grade 4 or higher. It is possible to start at this level on a completely new subject to you – but this will depend on your GCSE grades.

What courses can I do?

GCSEs, Apprenticeship, BTEC Diploma Level 2 or NVQ/VRQ Level 2

Level 3 | With this level of qualification, you could progress to university/degree-level qualifications or get a good job. You will need a minimum of five GCSEs at grade 4 or above or a Level 2 vocational qualification, but some A Levels require more.

T Levels are new courses which follow GCSEs and are equivalent to 3 A levels. These 2-year courses, which launched September 2020, have been developed in collaboration with employers and businesses so that the content meets the needs of industry and prepares students for work, further training, or study. T Levels offer students a mixture of classroom learning and 'on-the-job' experience during an industry placement of at least 315 hours (approximately 45 days).

What courses can I do?

A Levels, BTEC Extended Diploma, NVQ/VRQ Level 3 or Advanced Apprenticeship

Level 4| These courses provide you with an in-depth study which will help you become a specialist in your chosen area. You will need Level 3 qualifications such as A Levels, an Extended Diploma, an Access Higher Education qualification, an NVQ/VRQ Level 3 or 120 UCAS points.

Foundation Degree, Bachelor's/Honours Degree, Degree Apprenticeship or NVQ/VRQ Level 4

Traineeships

A Traineeship is a course designed for people between the ages of 16 and 24 who want to find a job or apprenticeship but don't have the right skills or experience.

What do Traineeships Include?

- Work preparation training which ensures you are ready and have confidence to take the first step in your career.
- Meaningful work experience which provides insight and experience of the world of work and makes
 you more attractive to potential employers.
- English and Maths support to help give you the literacy and numeracy skills needed for the workplace.

What are the Benefits of a Traineeship?

- A Traineeship will put you in a better position to compete for an Apprenticeship or a job.
- Traineeships give you the opportunity to build your CV and get vital experience with local and national employers.
- Improving your English and Maths skills will boost your chances of getting a job, as well as improving your long-term prospects and earning potential over your lifetime.

Apprenticeships

Apprenticeships can help you enter the world of employment and start building a career from the age of 16. An apprenticeship is a real job where you learn, gain experience, and get paid. You're an employee with a contract of employment and holiday leave.

By the end of an apprenticeship, you'll have the right skills and knowledge needed for your chosen career. It can take between one and six years to complete an apprenticeship depending on which one you choose, what level it is and your previous experience. Apprenticeships are funded from contributions made by the government and your employer.

Each apprenticeship has a level and an equivalent education level. You can start an apprenticeship at any level. Depending on the level, some apprenticeships may require previous qualifications such as an English or Maths GCSE or give extra training in the English or Maths skills needed so you're at the right level. At the end of your apprenticeship, you'll achieve the equivalent education level. For example, if you complete a level 3 apprenticeship, you'll achieve the equivalent of an A level.
