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Introduction

Welcome to North Somerset Council's Parents' Guide for applying for a school place in Reception ('Starting School') or Year 3 ('Transfer to Junior School'). It contains details about the different types of schools in North Somerset, their [Oversubscription Criteria](#), and information on North Somerset Council's [Home to School Transport](#) policy. It explains how to apply for schools (inside and outside of North Somerset) and how to make an application.

Starting school is one of the most important milestones in every child's life and to help you decide which school(s) to apply for, you may wish to read the school's prospectus, their [Ofsted](#) reports, look at school websites and visit the schools in person.

This guide contains a summary of the Admissions Arrangements for schools located within North Somerset. Since producing this guide, Admissions Arrangements may have been amended, and if you want to see full and/or final versions, please check the school's website or the council's [website](#) before you apply.

Whilst in previous years, most applicants have been offered their first preference school, not every school is able to offer a place to all those who apply. The "[Reception intake admissions](#)" section and "[Year 3 intake admissions](#)" section contain details of the types of schools in the North Somerset area, the numbers who applied and preferences offered in the previous five years.

We would recommend that you read the "[Primary Coordinated Admission Scheme 2023-24](#)", which contains important dates, information and definitions to help processing applications.

All Admissions Authorities in England must adhere to the [School Admissions Code](#), which is produced by the Department for Education (DfE). We would also recommend that you read through this before you start your application.

Please read all the information provided in this guide before submitting your application. Terms and abbreviations used throughout are available at the end of the guide.

All applications should be submitted to your Home Council by 15 January 2023.

Important dates

Starting School and Transfer to Junior School timetable for the 2023-24 school year.

From 12 September 2022	Applications for September 2023 school start will be accepted from the 12 September. Applications can be made online via North Somerset Council's website or on a paper form available to download or on request.
11.59pm on 15 January 2023	The deadline for applications to be submitted to North Somerset Council so they can be considered in the first round of allocations.
17 April 2023 National OfferDay	Offers of a school place will be sent out on this date to On Time applicants. If you applied online , you will receive an email from the School Admissions Team, you can log back in again at any time if you need to. If you completed a paper application, we will send your outcome by second class post on 17 April 2023.
30 April 2023	The date by which you should have responded to the offer of a school place.
12 May 2023	The last day by which we need to have received your intention to appeal, in order for your appeal to be heard before the start of the September term. If any appeals are received after this date, we will endeavour to have the appeal heard before the start of the September term but cannot guarantee this.
11.59pm on 12 May 2023	The Closing Date for the <u>second</u> round of allocations, which includes all late applications On Time applicants still seeking a place at one of their school preferences On Time applicants who have changed their preference(s) allocation of any places declined by parents
Week commencing 29 May 2023	Offers of a school place will be posted during this week to all applicants from the second round of allocations.
11.59pm on 23 June 2023	The Closing Date for the <u>third</u> round of allocations, which includes all late applications On Time applicants still seeking a place at one of their school preferences On Time applicants who have changed their preference(s) allocation of any places declined by parents
Week commencing 3 July 2023	Offers of a school place will be posted during this week to all applicants from the third round of allocations. Further admission rounds will take place, as and when required, until the end of the coordinated admissions process.
From June to August 2023	If you are refused a place at your preferred school and have decided to appeal for a place before the appeal deadline, you should have an appeal hearing during this period.
Up to and including 31 August 2023	The Coordinated Admissions process will continue to operate, with application data being exchanged with other Councils as necessary, for all applications received during this time.

Coordinated admissions scheme

Councils are required to coordinate admissions for all schools within their area. This means they have to publish Admissions Arrangements for all publicly funded schools.

The application must be made to the applicant's home Council, regardless of where the schools that you are applying to are situated.

The home Council will share details of the application with the relevant Council. Councils outside of North Somerset will share details of applications made for any other Own Admission Authority schools within its own area so that offers can be made. For details of the Oversubscription Criteria of schools in other Councils please check out the website of the relevant Council.

Own Admission Authority schools have their own Oversubscription Criteria. Application forms for North Somerset residents for all schools, must be returned to the North Somerset School Admissions Team, who will notify all On Time applicants of the result of their applications on the same National Offer Day.

Pupil Projections for North Somerset Council

The Local Authority is required to produce pupil forecasting statistics to identify needs for future provision across the district and inform the strategic planning of school places across North Somerset for the next 5-7 years. This is a complex process that depends on many factors, which can be difficult to predict over time. The model is trend-based using known factors such as birth rates and current school census information. However, some areas are less certain, such as parental choice, school performance, and new housing completions.

The last 20 years has seen significant growth in North Somerset and further large-scale development is planned over the next decade, as a result of the Local Plan. The model has been developed over a number of years and is continually refined and enhanced. Department for Education (DfE) analysis showed the level of accuracy of the North Somerset projections was 99.8% for 1 year and 95.2% for 3 years ahead at primary level; and 99.6% for 1 year ahead and 93.3% for 3 years ahead at secondary level due to overestimation [School capacity scorecard; June 2020 – not published in 2021].

How to apply for a school place

You are **strongly** advised to read this guide (and that of any other Councils outside of North Somerset as applicable). The [Reception](#) and [Year 3](#) sections of this guide have allocation information for the previous five years that you may find useful. You may also read school prospectuses, [Ofsted reports](#), look at school websites and visit the schools in person.

All complete applications must be submitted by 11.59pm on 15 January 2023 to be considered as an On Time application.

As a North Somerset resident, you can apply for places at schools in other Councils, but you **must** do so using a North Somerset application form. When making the application, you should check with the school, or it's Council, to see if any additional documents such as [Supplementary Information Forms](#) are required and how and when to submit them.

If your child's surname has changed at any time, please complete the form using your child's legal name and include the appropriate legal documentation.

Please also consider how your child will get to school when making your preferences. You may wish to look at the [Home to School Transport](#) policy.


It is your responsibility to provide all details relevant to your child's application.

For example, if your child has any siblings at one of your preference schools, it is your responsibility to provide name(s) and date of birth(s) for any sibling(s) and make sure that this sibling link is added to the application.


You can either apply [online](#) or by using a [paper application form](#).

All applications are considered equally and in accordance with the relevant admissions arrangements. All applications are considered in line with the [equal preference system](#) and are not treated on a first come first served basis.


North Somerset Primary Schools




North Somerset Primary Schools - North area



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


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North Somerset Primary Schools - Central area



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Applying online

If you live in North Somerset, please ensure that your application is completed using the North Somerset application system and not that of any other Council, even if the school you are applying for is outside North Somerset.

If you have completed an online application, you do not need to submit a paper application.

A step by step guide on how to use the online application system is available on our [North Somerset Council website](#).

You can access the [online application](#) via the [School Admissions Team website](#) until 11.59pm on 15 January 2023. There are occasions when the system needs to back-up when it might not be available, this usually happens between 20:00 and 20:30.

We would advise you to familiarise yourself with the [online](#) system before the National Closing Date, so that you know how to use the site and if you have any queries you have time to get help or more information before the National Closing Date.

If you need advice or assistance with completing your application, please [contact North Somerset Council](#). The council will try to resolve any problems you have with online applications, but the council cannot provide detailed technical support.

Make sure you submit your application by the National Closing Date. If you need to contact the school admissions team, please allow sufficient time for a response, which may take up to 10 working days.

If you are unable to complete the application in one session, the system will remember the details you have entered for your next online visit. If you start your application but do not submit it, the admissions system will send an automated reminder to your email address before the National Closing Date.

IMPORTANT – To prevent emails from the online application service going into your spam or junk folders please add the email address eduadmissions.online@n-somerset.gov.uk to your list of approved senders. This is an unmonitored account so do not reply to any emails.

Once you have submitted your application you will be sent an email acknowledging that North Somerset Council have received your online application and confirming your preferences. Your notification by email is your proof that you have made your application. If you do not receive this email and have checked your junk/spam emails, you should assume your application has not been received and [contact the School Admissions Team](#).

You can make changes to your preferences up to 11.59pm on the National Closing Date, **but please make sure you click the 'resubmit' button on your application**. You will receive an email to confirm it has been resubmitted.

Applications must be submitted, by 11.59pm on the National Closing Date, to be considered during the first round of allocations. Unsubmitted applications, or unsubmitted changes of preferences will not be considered.

You will receive an email notification with the result of your application on the National Offer Day, which will contain your outcome, information on the options available to you and how to respond.

Closing date for applications is 11.59pm on the National Closing Date, 15 January 2023.

Paper applications

Paper applications are available to download from [North Somerset Council's website](#), and are available upon request.

You only need to apply once, if you apply more than once only the most recent submission will be considered.

Fill the form in as completely and accurately as possible, we recommend that you read this guide fully before submitting, as any mistakes may affect the outcome of your application.

To return your paper application, you can either email it, post it or hand deliver a hard copy to Town Hall or Castlewood reception.

When emailing School Admissions, you should receive an automated confirmation email. If you do not receive this email and have checked your junk/spam emails, you should assume your application has not been received and [contact the School Admissions Team](#).

When posting or hand delivering paper applications it is recommended that you obtain independent proof of postage, such as recorded delivery for posting or a receipt for hand delivering to either Town Hall or Castlewood.

If you wish to change anything after you have submitted your paper application, please email the School Admissions Team at admissions@n-somerset.gov.uk or submit a new application form.

If you apply On Time but your application has not been fully completed, North Somerset Council may contact you to request the outstanding information. If the required information/documentation is not provided by the date specified, the application may not be considered in the first round of allocations.

An outcome letter will be posted to you, by second class post. These are put in the post on the National Offer Day (17 April 2023) and may take several days to be delivered.

Late applications

If you apply late, we may not be able to offer you a place at any of your preferences. This rule applies even if you already have a sibling at your preferred school, or you live very close to it.

Our [online](#) application system cannot accept any applications after 11.59pm on the National Closing Date. Late applicants will only be able to apply using a [paper application form](#).

Late applicants will be informed of the outcome of their application during the next appropriate allocations round.

Applications received after 11.59pm on the National Closing Date will not be considered in the first round of allocations, unless North Somerset Council considers there are extenuating reasons (see below) for allowing them to be accepted as On Time.

Examples of an extenuating reason may include the following:

1. The child is from a family of a Crown Servant or of UK Service Personnel family, and the Closing date for applications is 11.59pm on the National Closing Date, 15 January 2023.

- MOD, FCO or GCHQ has provided a letter declaring a return date and residency area.
2. The application was late due to a significant health/medical reason which did not allow an application to be made On Time. Independent confirmation of this will need to be provided.
 3. The child is, or becomes, a 'Child in Care.'

If an application has been made before 11.59pm on the National Closing Date and the School Admissions Team are later made aware that a child:

- is, was or has become a Child in Care;
- has an appropriate brother or sister link;
- or any other detail that may affect how the Over Subscription Criteria is applied (not including changes of address)

the School Admissions Team will try to include the information in the first round of allocations. This may not be possible if the allocation process has reached a stage where it would be impractical to include such information.

If both parents apply separately

If two people share [parental responsibility](#) and both submit an application form, North Somerset Council will ask you both to determine which application it should consider, and which application should be withdrawn. If you are unable to reach an agreement, you should resolve the issue through the court system, for example, by obtaining a 'Specific Issues Order' which specifies which parent has responsibility to make decisions on school preferences.

In the absence of any Order, the decision as to which application should be accepted will be determined by drawing lots. Whichever application is accepted, the address where the child spends the majority of his/her time will be the one considered by North Somerset Council to be the home address.

Any Supplementary Information Forms and additional evidence for the above schools must be submitted directly to the school and not to North Somerset Council.

Preferences

You can name up to three school preferences on your application form, but you are not guaranteed to be offered a place at any of these schools.

Complete the form using the schools you prefer in numerical order. Private, Independent or Special Educational Needs schools are not processed by the North Somerset School Admissions Team.

We recommend that you use all three preferences to increase your chances of being offered a place at a school you would prefer your child to attend.

When completing your preferences, please think about which schools your child is most likely to be offered. This will reduce the chance of having to consider schools that might be further away.

Priority is not given to applicants who only state one preference, and neither will listing the same school for all three preferences increase your chances of getting a place there. If you do not state a second or third preference and we cannot offer your only preference, then a place will be allocated at the nearest school with a vacancy once all other applicants' preferences are considered. This could mean a place at a school much further away from your home.

You must apply for a school in order to be considered for a place there.

When you are choosing your school preferences, please take into account how your child will get there. You may wish to look at the [home to school transport policy](#) to see if you qualify for free travel assistance.

Whilst North Somerset Council has a responsibility to make a school place available to each North Somerset child, we cannot guarantee each child a place at any of your named preferences or at your nearest school.

Equal preference system

Applications for all schools are considered under an 'equal preference system'. This means that all your preferences are considered equally against the admissions Oversubscription Criteria for the schools.

If your child qualifies for a place at more than one of your preferences, we will offer the highest ranked preference possible.

Preference reasons

You may give reasons on your application form for your preferences, but **all allocations must be made in accordance with the [Oversubscription Criteria](#) for each of the schools.**

North Somerset do not operate a health/medical or social reasons criteria and only reason(s) that fall within the relevant Oversubscription Criteria will be taken into account.

Who can apply

Children born between 1 September 2018 and 31 August 2019 can apply for Reception Year at Infant, First, and Primary schools in 2023-24.

Children born between 1 September 2015 and 31 August 2016 can apply for transfer to Junior schools in September 2023-24.

Applications will be accepted for children who meet one or more of the following:

- UK residents
- British Citizen Passport holders
- are from countries whose passports have been endorsed to show that they have the [right to abode](#) in this country

Those who live outside of England and wish to attend a North Somerset school should apply directly to North Somerset Council.

If the child is a child in care (looked after child) then the application **must** be completed and submitted by the child's social worker.

Applications must be made and signed by a person with parental responsibility for the child.

Parental responsibility

Parental responsibility is defined under the Children Act 1989 as being all the rights, duties, powers, responsibilities, and authority which, by law, a parent of a child has.

People who have parental responsibility are:

- The child's mother, who always has parental responsibility unless the child has been adopted
- The child's father (if married to the child's mother at the time of the child's birth or any time afterwards, or is listed on the child's birth certificate)
- The child's unmarried father can acquire parental responsibility by:
 - Entering into a formal documented agreement with the mother in a manner prescribed by law i.e. a Parental Responsibility Agreement
 - Making a successful application to the Court for a Parental Responsibility Order
 - Being appointed the child's guardian by the Court or by the child's mother in her Will –For children's births registered on or after 1 December 2003 – by registering the father's name on the birth certificate
- The child's adoptive parents
- The child's guardian (appointed under a Will)
- Any person who has a Child Arrangements Order which states the child must reside with them (NB parental responsibility will only last for the continuance of the order). This includes those with a pre-existing Residence Order, (which is now known as a Child Arrangements Order).
- The Local Authority, if a Care Order is in force in respect of that child
- A step parent either by:
 - Agreement with both parents

- Court Order
- Adoption

If you are the applicant and do not have parental responsibility, please attach a letter from a person with parental responsibility granting you the authority to make the application on their behalf and giving a brief explanation as to the circumstances, add any additional supportive evidence to the letter. This will be considered by North Somerset Council and we will inform you of the outcome.

If two people share parental responsibility and both submit an application form, North Somerset Council will ask you both to determine which application it should consider, and which application should be withdrawn. If you are unable to reach an agreement between you and you do not have a 'Specific Issues Order' the decision as to which application should be accepted will be determined by the North Somerset Schools Admissions Team drawing lots. Whichever application is accepted, the address where the child spends the majority of his/her time will be the one considered by North Somerset Council to be the home address.

Home address

The address on the application form must be where the child is ordinarily resident. Fraudulent admission applications may lead to the withdrawal of any place offered.

If you [move address](#) after applying for a school place, please provide proof of your new address. Proof of address can be any of the following:

- solicitor's letter confirming the exchange of contracts with a completion date
- tenancy agreement signed by both parties
- utility bill dated within three months prior to submission

Child's home address

North Somerset Council will consider the child's home address to be the place where the child permanently and ordinarily resides for the majority of the time as at the National Closing Date. This would normally be the same address as a person who has parental responsibility for the child as their main carer.

An address used for childcare arrangements cannot be used as the home address, this includes addresses which belong to a family member. North Somerset Council will not accept an address for a child which is different from his/her parents and expressly linked to obtaining a school place.

Where parents do not live together, and the child spends equal amounts of time with both parents, North Somerset Council will consider the home of the parent who made the application to be the child's home.

North Somerset Council will not accept more than one address as the child's home address. If necessary, the terms of a residency Order will clarify the home address.

If you share parental responsibility for your child and both of you submit an application form, North Somerset Council will ask you both to determine which application it should consider, and which application should be withdrawn. If you are unable to reach an agreement between you, North Somerset Council will ask to see a residency order for clarification.

In the absence of any residency order, North Somerset Council will consider the home address to be the parent with the primary day to day care and control of the child. In reaching this decision,

North Somerset Council may request evidence from you both. Examples of evidence would be the address of the parent who receives Child Benefit and/or the address which is registered with a medical GP. Parents are urged to reach agreement but where they do not, North Somerset Council will determine the home address.

If a child who usually lives in North Somerset is temporarily living in a different area, North Somerset will continue to be his/her home Council.

Proof of address

Any offer of a school place based on where your child lives is conditional on your child living at that address on the National Closing Date, except for those [moving house](#) who have submitted the required evidence in time.

After the National Closing Date, North Somerset Council will check the address on your application against the records the council holds for the applicant and the child. The council may also write to ask you to provide proof of your address.

North Somerset Council will investigate any applications where there is doubt about the address being given. **Use of false information may lead the council to withdraw an offer of a place, even after your child has started at a school.**

If you believe that a fraudulent application has been made, please [contact the School Admissions Team](#). Any information received will be treated in total confidence and your identity will not be divulged to anyone.

North Somerset Council and schools can undertake checks at any time to ensure that an applicant is (or will be) living at a property. Applicants may be asked to provide documentation, for example a copy of a recent gas or electricity bill, to prove that they live at their stated home address.

If you cannot provide proof of address, we cannot consider your application in the first round of allocations, which could mean that your preferred schools could already be full. In which case a place will be allocated at the nearest school to your home address with a place available.

Moving house

You must inform North Somerset Council if you change address as soon as possible or your place could be withdrawn.

If you are going to move after the National Closing Date but before the start of term 1 and you can provide independent confirmation of this before 11.59pm on the National Closing Date, we will be able to consider your new address in the first round of allocations.

Examples of independent confirmation of a change of address are:

- a solicitor's letter confirming the exchange of contracts with a completion date
- a tenancy agreement signed by both parties
- a utility bill dated within three months prior to submission

If the child is from a family of a Crown Servant or of UK Service Personnel, we will accept a letter from the MOD, FCO or GCHQ declaring a return date and residency area.

Occasionally, we may ask you to provide proof that you have left your previous property, for example by supplying a final account utility bill.

If you are moving out of North Somerset and into another Council area, then your new home Council will then process the application and notify you of the outcome.

Fraudulent applications

If a child obtained a school place based on fraudulent or intentionally misleading information, North Somerset Council can withdraw an offer of a school place.

It is important that all information listed on your application is correct. If you move address but do not inform us, we will assume that this is intentionally misleading.

If North Somerset Council are notified of a potential fraudulent application, or if there is any evidence to imply that the information submitted on an application is fraudulent, the School Admissions Team will open a fraudulent investigation file and contact you asking for substantial additional evidence to prove the information submitted on your application is correct.

If your application is considered to be fraudulent, either intentionally or unintentionally, and your child has been offered school a place based on that information, that place will be withdrawn if it means another child has been wrongly refused a place at a school.

Your application will then be considered again during the next round of allocations using the correct information.

If you believe that a fraudulent application has been made, please [contact the School Admissions Team](#). Any information received will be treated in total confidence and your identity will not be divulged to anyone.

Changing preferences

When applying online, your notification by email is your proof that you have made your application. If you do not receive this email and have checked your junk/spam emails, you should assume your application has not been received and [contact the School Admissions Team](#).

To return your paper application, you can either email it, post it or hand deliver a hard copy to Town Hall or Castlewood reception.

When emailing School Admissions, you should receive an automated confirmation email. If you do not receive this email and have checked your junk/spam emails, you should assume your application has not been received and [contact the School Admissions Team](#).

When posting or hand delivering paper applications it is recommended that you obtain independent proof of postage, such as recorded delivery for posting or a receipt for hand delivering to either Town Hall or Castlewood.

Before the National Closing Date

You can change your preferences, up until 11.59pm on the National Closing Date.

You submit your changes instantly when applying [online](#) (please remember to press the 'submit' button). You will receive a confirmation email detailing the changes that have been made and this

will override any previous applications.

If you apply on a paper application form, please be sure to allow plenty of time for it to arrive before 11.59pm on the National Closing Date. This will override any previous applications.

After the National Closing Date, but before applications are sent to other Councils

Changes of preference(s) will not be accepted after 11.59pm on the National Closing Date for the first round of allocations, unless North Somerset Council consider there are extenuating reasons for allowing it to be treated as On Time. Please submit any reasons for a late application in writing to the School Admissions Team so that we can consider your case.

If you are moving home, please refer to the [home address – moving house](#) section.

After applications are sent to other Councils but before National Offer Day

Changes of preference(s) will not be accepted after 11.59pm on the National Closing Date for the first round of allocations.

If you no longer wish your preferences to be considered in the first round, you must let us know and we will withdraw them.

You can change your preferences once you have been notified of the outcome of your original application. Any new preferences will be considered in subsequent rounds of allocations.

If you are moving home, please refer to the [moving house](#) section.

After National Offer Day

The new application will be treated as a late application and considered in the next round of allocations.

We cannot guarantee that your new application will be successful, this will depend on the availability of places in the next round of allocations.

If a place can be offered from the new application, any school place already offered or accepted will automatically be withdrawn.

Outcome of application

On the National Offer Day, 17 April 2023, North Somerset Council will make an offer of a school place to you, provided that your application was received on time.

If you applied [online](#), you can log into the online system from midnight on the National Offer Day to view the result of the application. An email will be sent to you after 5.00am.

If you applied on a paper application form, letters will be sent by second class, on the National Offer Day, and may take several days to arrive.

You must respond to the offer of a place to the School Admissions Team by **30 April 2023**. The offer may be withdrawn if no response is received.

A statement of options, which you are encouraged to read before responding to the outcome, will be published on the council's website on National Offer Day, which sets out your options and how to respond to school places offers.

If you are not offered a place at one of your preference schools

If your child is a resident in North Somerset and we are unable to offer a place at one of your preferred schools, they will be offered a place at an alternative school.

If your child lives in North Somerset, the school offered will be the next nearest school with a place available. Depending on where you live, this may not be a North Somerset school. Please see the [coordinated scheme](#) for full details.

If you are not offered a place at your preferred school, you can:

- accept the alternative place offered
- request to go on the waiting list (for schools where a place has been refused)
- appeal to an independent Appeal Panel against the decision to refuse a place
- make new preferences

Waiting lists

North Somerset Council and schools which are their Own Admission Authority will hold a list of those applicants still seeking a place until 31 December 2023. **If you would like to be added to the waiting list, you must let North Somerset Council know.** We will not add you to a waiting list without your specific request to do so.

All applications will be ranked in line with the [Oversubscription Criteria](#) and any allocations will be made using this. Every time a child is added to the waiting list we will alter the existing rankings, which could alter existing positions. Waiting list positions can go down as well as up, as additional applicants are added or removed from the waiting list. Priority is not given on the basis of the date an application was added to the list.

If your child is on a waiting list for a school, and a place subsequently becomes available, that place will be offered in accordance with the school's [Oversubscription Criteria](#).

In line with the [School Admissions Code](#), a child can only have one offer of a place at a time. This means that when a child is offered a place from the waiting list, it will result in **any currently allocated school being automatically withdrawn**.

If you have decided to keep the offered school place, and no longer wish to stay on a waiting list, it is imperative that you contact the School Admissions Team and ask to be taken off the waiting list(s).

North Somerset Council and/or Own Admission Authority schools will hold a list of applicants seeking a place at their preferred schools until 31 December 2023. After this date, it will be maintained on a two-term basis. If applicants wish to remain on the waiting list, they must request this for the start of terms 1, 3 or 5.

Please see the relevant schools [Admissions Arrangements](#) for details of how to stay on the waiting list past this date.

Changing preferences and/or making new preferences

You can change your preferences after the National Offer Day. However, there is no guarantee that you will be successful in obtaining a place at any of your new preferences, as many schools will not have available places after National Offer Day.

If a place can be offered from the new application, any school place already offered or accepted will automatically be withdrawn.

Details of the availability of places at North Somerset schools will be published on the [council's website](#) on or shortly after the National Offer Day.

Any changes in preference will be considered during the next round of allocations.

Further allocation rounds

Applications received after 11.59pm on the National Closing Date will be considered in the admissions rounds following the National Offer Day.

Places will be offered to

- late applicants
- applicants on waiting lists
- applicants who subsequently changed their preferences

The deadline for any changes or additional information to be included in the second, or subsequent, round is shown in the [important dates](#) section.

Appeals

Under the [School Standards and Framework Act 1998](#) (as amended by subsequent Acts) and the [School Admission Appeals Code](#), (produced by the Department for Education (DfE)), you have the right to appeal against any decision made by or on behalf of the Admissions Authority.

You can appeal for a place at any school named as a preference on your application, that you have been refused a place at.

You cannot appeal for a school which was not named as a preference on your application, nor for a school that is a lower preference than the offered school. You also cannot appeal regarding the site allocation at a school.

The [School Admission Appeals Code](#) of Practice provides that an appeal hearing should be held within a reasonable time. Appeals made in the normal admission round (On Time applications) must be heard within 40 school days of the specified Closing Date for the receipt of appeals. Should you be unsuccessful in obtaining a place for your child at one of the school preferences, you will be notified of the Closing Date for receipt of appeals for that school.

Parents wishing to exercise your right to appeal will be asked to submit your appeal as soon as possible to enable hearings to be scheduled within this period. All appeals received by the deadline should be heard before the end of the term preceding entry. If any appeals are received after the deadline, we will endeavour to have the appeal heard before the start of the September term but cannot guarantee this.

Infant class size legislation

It is a legal requirement that infant classes (those where the majority of children will reach the age of 5, 6 or 7 during the school year) **must not exceed 30 children to one teacher**. This is known as "infant class size".

Parents often find it frustrating when they realise how very limited the powers of the appeal panel are for infant class size appeals. This is being drawn to your attention now so you can make an informed decision on whether to appeal or not.

The panel may only uphold the appeal where:

1. it finds that the admission of additional children would not breach the infant class size limit; or
2. it finds that the admission arrangements did not comply with admissions law or were not correctly and impartially applied, and the child would have been offered a place if the arrangements had complied or had been correctly and impartially applied; or
3. it decides that the decision to refuse admission was not one which a reasonable admission authority would have made in the circumstances of the case.

Most parents who have been refused a place at their preferred school consider this refusal to be perverse. But the word has a stronger meaning in its legal sense. It means 'beyond the range of responses open to a reasonable decision maker', or 'a decision which is so outrageous in its defiance of logic or of accepted moral standards that no sensible person who had applied their mind to the question could have arrived at it'. **A decision that makes it impossible for you to transport all your family to school on time, or even impossible for you to continue working, is very unlikely to be perverse. The courts have established this.**

Deferring and delaying

Although children are not legally required to attend school until the term following their fifth birthday, all children are entitled to a full-time place in a Reception class in the September following their fourth birthday.

If your child was born between 1 April 2017 and 31 August 2018, and you formally applied for and received approval to delay your child's admission until September 2023, you may apply for a reception place in 2023. **Your application will need to be made on a paper application form and returned before the National Closing Date to be considered as On Time.**

Deferring a school place

If your child was born between 1 September and 31 March, places may be deferred until the start of term in January or April, but no later than the term following the child's fifth birthday. The school place will be held for your child and will not be offered to another child.

If your child was born between 1 April and 31 August, places may be deferred until the start of term in January or April for Reception, or the next September for a place in Year 1. Please be aware that if you wish to defer your child's entry to school until Year 1 in September 2024, any place offered will not be held and you will need to reapply from 1 July 2024.

You can also request that your child takes up their place on a part-time basis until they reach compulsory school age. Please contact the Headteacher directly to discuss any of these options.

If you wish for your child to start Year 1 in September 2024, please notify the School Admissions Team as soon as possible.

Delayed and accelerated entry

You can request that your child is educated outside of their normal chronological age group if you believe this to be in the child's best interests.

Please submit your request to admit your child into the year group above or below their usual chronological age group in writing to the Admissions Authorities of your preferred schools.

Decisions will be made on an individual basis and taking into account the following:

- the views of the parent
- information about the social, emotional and academic development of the child (often supported by education and other professionals)
- the views of the Headteacher and governing body if appropriate
- the child's medical history and the views of a medical professional if relevant
- whether the child has previously been educated out of their normal age group
- whether the child may have naturally have fallen into a lower age group if they were not born prematurely

Please read North Somerset Council's [Guidance on delayed and deferred entry to school requests](#), and the [advice on the admission of summer born children](#) which is issued by the Department for Education, which should help answer any queries you may have.

You should still submit an On Time application for your child to start school in 2023 in case any request is refused.

Making a request for your child to be educated out of cohort

Your request will be considered by the Admissions Authority of your preferred school(s). All requests will take into account the views of the Headteacher of the school(s).

You will need to put your request in writing, or email, and detail the reasons why you feel it would be in your child's best interests to delay or accelerate starting school. You should enclose copies of any relevant reports which support your request, although you are not expected to commission a report solely for this purpose.

Once you have compiled your request, you will need to send this to the Headteacher of your preference schools. The Headteacher should then respond to you in writing stating whether or not they and the Governing Body are in support of your request.

If you are applying for places at a Community or Voluntary Controlled school, your written request, along with the Headteachers response, will need to be sent to North Somerset Council School Admissions to be considered.

If you are applying for places at schools that are Voluntary Aided, Trust, Foundation, Free schools or Academies, your request will be considered by the Governors of your preference schools. You should read the school's [admissions policy](#) for more details on how they will consider your request.

If your request is agreed, you will need to apply again the following year for the new cohort and withdraw your current application. Please note that out of cohort requests should be made on a paper application form, as our [online system](#) will not recognise the date of birth.

If your request is refused, any application for a place in Reception or Year 3 for September 2023 will continue to be processed. If you have not yet applied, you will need to ensure you make an application on a paper form as soon as possible.

There are no rights of appeal against the decision to admit your child to a particular year group. However, if your request is refused, you can make a complaint to the Admissions Authority directly.

Home to school transport

North Somerset Council provide help with transport for children who meet the following criteria:

- are aged up to eight years and live further than two miles from their nearest school by the shortest walking route
- are aged eight and above and live further than three miles from their nearest school by the shortest walking route
- need to use a route that has been classed as dangerous
- have certain medical conditions, disabilities, or a statement of complex needs.

Reception intake admissions

First Geographical Areas (previously known as catchment areas)

Some schools have a First Geographical Area, which is an area of priority for a school. Living in this area does not guarantee a child a place at the school, but they are likely to receive priority over children who live outside the First Geographical Area.

If you would like to check if an address is in a First Geographical Area, please check [on North Somerset Council website](#) by entering an address at the top of the screen.

You may apply for any school but if you are not offered a place at any of your preference schools, there is no guarantee that you will be offered your nearest or First Geographical Area School if these weren't one of your preferences.

If a school has a First Geographical Area a map will be included alongside its Oversubscription Criteria shown below.

Oversubscription criteria

A summary of the Oversubscription Criteria is given below. The full 2023-24 Admissions Oversubscription Criteria, including definitions, is available on [North Somerset Council's website](#) or on the individual school's website.

Infant Class Size Regulations limit the number of children in a class to 30 where the majority of children reach the age of 5, 6 or 7 during the school year. This legal requirement means that children will be refused places once there are 30 children in a class. Some schools may have single teacher classes with fewer than 30 children. The class size limits does not mean that schools have to admit up to 30 children into each of their classes.

If your child attends the nursery provision of a primary school, you must still apply for a reception place. **Attending the nursery at a school does not guarantee admission to a reception class.** A few schools in North Somerset have oversubscription criteria relating to eligibility of an applicant for pupil premium and attending the school nursery. Please check individual schools' [admissions policies](#) to see if this applies.

Where a school is named in a child's Statement of Special Educational Needs or Education, Health and Care Plan, the Admissions Authority for the school is legally required to admit the child to the school. Any such child will be allocated a place at the named school **before** the [Oversubscription Criteria](#) is applied.

If a school is not oversubscribed, all new intake applicants will be offered a place.

Should a school receive more applications than the Admission Number would allow, the Oversubscription Criteria will be used to determine who will be allocated the places. All applications will be ranked in accordance with the Oversubscription Criteria.

Year 3 intake admissions

The 2023-24 school year for Junior transfers is for children born between 1 September 2015 and 31 August 2016.

Transferring up to a paired Junior school is not automatic, you must make an application, otherwise you will not be considered for a place.

If your child is currently attending a Primary school, you do not need to do anything. You only need to apply for a Junior school if you would like your child to transfer to a Junior school.

Allocations will be made in accordance with the relevant Oversubscription Criteria so places at a paired Junior school cannot be guaranteed. However, the current Junior criteria (with the exception of children with a Statement of SEN or an Education, Health and Care Plan that names a school and Children in (or previously in) Care), gives children attending a paired Infant school priority over other children. Changing schools during the school year

If your child already attends a school, but you would like them to move to a different one, you can apply to change schools. This is also known as an in-year transfer.

In year transfer applications will not normally be considered until 21 days in advance of the date the place is required (35 days in advance for those moving house), excluding deferred entry for Reception Year Group children and families of UK service personnel with a confirmed posting, or crown servants returning from overseas. In year transfer applications for admission in September will be considered from 1 June.

Applications are normally processed within ten school days of receiving a complete application. Please note, school days do not include school holidays, bank holidays or weekends.

It is the responsibility of the parents of foreign national children to check that their children have a right under their [UK entry conditions](#) to study at a school before applying for a place. Parents can find more information at [Visas and Immigration](#).

Foreign nationals who do not normally reside in the UK but who wish to apply for a state-funded school place, are responsible for checking that their children have an immigration status which permits them to enter the UK to access a state-funded school. **Checking is the parents' responsibility, not the local authority's responsibility.** Children may be breaching their UK entry conditions by entering the country in order to attend a state-funded school if they do not have an immigration status that permits such study.

Who to apply to

Some schools process their own in-year applications. Please check who you need to apply to before applying.

Online applications

If you are applying using North Somerset's [online application system](#), we will forward the application to any school that processes their own in year applications.

Paper applications

If you are submitting a paper application, you may need to submit multiple application forms.

Any preferences for schools that process their own in-year applications must be sent to the relevant school, with only that school as a preference. You can apply for more than one school, but they must be on separate forms and submitted to the schools individually.

Any preferences for schools that North Somerset Council process in-year applications for, can all be made on the same paper application form, expressing up to three preferences.

How to apply

The quickest and easiest way to apply for a school place is on the [North Somerset Council website](#).

You will need to set up an account on the Citizens Portal, our [online admissions system](#). A [guide](#) is available on how to apply online.

Alternatively you can send a [paper application form](#).

Closing date for applications is 11.59pm on the National Closing Date, 15 January 2023.

What happens next

If you have applied [online](#), we will email you to let you know the outcome of your application.

If you applied by post and you opted to receive the outcome via email, we will email you the outcome of your application. If you have not opted to receive the outcome via email we will send you a letter, by second class post, to let you know the result of your application.

Applications are usually processed within ten working days. This may not be possible during school holidays as we may be unable to contact the school.

If you are happy with your allocated school place, you will need to accept it. Online applicants can email their response. Paper applicants can fill in the response form, which will be included in your outcome letter, and post it back to us, or email us the response.

If you do not get the school place you want, you can be put on a waiting list for your preference school(s) and you can appeal. Information on how to do this will be included in your application outcome.

You can also withdraw your application and make a new one with new school preferences.

Fair Access Protocol

[Fair Access Protocol](#) is a policy that exists for changing schools during the school year (also known as in-year applications), which ensures access to education is secured quickly for children who have no school place, but for whom a place at a mainstream school or alternative provision is appropriate.

It is also to ensure that all schools in an area admit their fair share of children with challenging behaviour, including children that may have been excluded from other schools.

Along with devolved funding and responsibility for alternative provision, an agreed protocol encourages Local Authorities and schools to work together in partnership to improve behaviour, tackle persistent absence and help support improving behaviour partnerships.

The Fair Access Protocol is to be used where a place has/cannot be allocated using the council's normal Admissions Arrangements or where a pupil has been admitted to a school and when, after receipt of the file from the previous school, the current school considers the child meets the requirements of this protocol. Children who are the subject of a direction by a Local Authority to admit or who are allocated a school in accordance with an In-Year Fair Access Protocol for school places, will take precedence over those on a waiting list or those whose names have been given to the council.

Terms and abbreviations

The terms, abbreviations, and legal extracts that we need to use in this guide may sometimes be difficult to understand so we hope these explanations will help.

Academies

Academies are schools which are funded directly by the Government rather than through the Local Authority. Any reference to schools within this guide includes Academies.

Admissions Authority

The body responsible for setting and applying a school's admissions arrangements. For Community or Voluntary Controlled schools, this body is the Local Authority unless it has agreed to delegate responsibility to the Governing Body. For Foundation or Voluntary Aided schools, this body is the Governing Body of the school. For Academies, this body is the Academy Trust.

Admissions Arrangements

The overall procedure, practices and oversubscription criteria used in deciding the allocation of school places including any device or means used to determine whether a school place is to be offered.

Admission Number

Every school has an Admission Number which is agreed between the school, the Local Authority and the Department of Education. This represents the number of places available in the year group that pupils would usually join the school, i.e. the Reception Year in Infant and Primary schools or Year 3 in Junior schools.

Children in Care

'Children in Care' are children who are (a) in the care of a local Council or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local Council in the exercise of their social services functions (see the definition in section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989).

For Children previously in Care:

- this includes children who were adopted under the Adoption Act 1976 (see s. 12 Adoption Orders) and children who were adopted under the Adoption and Children Act 2002 (see s.46 Adoption Orders)
- child arrangements orders are defined in s.8 of the Children Act 1989, as amended by s.12 of the Children and Families Act 2014. Child arrangements orders replaced residence orders and any residence order in force prior to 22 April 2014 is deemed to be a child arrangements order
- in accordance with s. 14A of the Children Act 1989, a Special Guardianship Order is defined as an Order appointing one or more individuals to be a child's special guardian (or special guardians)
- Children who appear (to the admission authority) to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted.

References to previously looked after children means such children who were adopted (or subject to child arrangements orders or special guardianship orders) immediately following having been looked after.

National Closing Date

The National Closing Date for school applications to be considered as On Time. The National Closing Date for Primary applications, set by the DfE, is 15 January 2023. The time applications close on the National Closing Date can vary between different Local Authorities. North Somerset Council has set the closing time to 11.59pm to allow residents the maximum amount of time to apply.

Closing date for applications is 11.59pm on the National Closing Date, 15 January 2023.

Community Schools

Community schools are fully maintained by a Council. The council is the Admissions Authority and is responsible for determining the Admissions Arrangements, Oversubscription Criteria and allocation of school places.

Council (Authority)

North Somerset Council' is the local Council (often known as the 'Local Authority') for people and schools within North Somerset. All references within this guide to 'the council', 'the authority', the 'local Council' or 'Local Authority' means North Somerset Council.

The 'home Council' is the council in which the child lives, regardless of where the schools being applied for are situated. North Somerset Council is the home Council for North Somerset residents. People who live outside North Somerset will have a different home Council.

Denominational schools

Catholic and Church of England (C of E) schools. They may be Voluntary Aided or Voluntary Controlled and are run in partnership between a Council and either Church of England, Catholic Church, Methodist Church or Baptist Church.

First Geographical Area (FGA)

Living in a school's FGA does not guarantee a place at the school. However, applicants living in the FGA may have a higher priority for places than those who live outside the FGA (except for Children in Care and Children with an Education, Health Care Plan that names the school). Please check the [Oversubscription Criteria](#) for the specific school.

Infant Class Size Regulations

Infant classes (those where the majority of children will reach the age of 5, 6 or 7 during the school year) must not contain more than 30 pupils with a single school teacher. Additional children may be admitted under limited exceptional circumstances, as stated in section 2.15 of the [School Admissions Code](#). Infant class size regulations also restrict the powers of an independent appeals panel. Please see our [School appeals guide for North Somerset Schools](#) for more information.

Infant Schools

Infant schools cover the Reception to Year 2 age groups. Normally, children from these schools will transfer to a Junior school or the Junior part of a Primary school to continue their education. Pupils moving from an Infant school to a Junior or Primary school must make a new application for a Year 3 place when appropriate. This change is not made automatically.

Junior Schools

Junior schools cover the Year 3 to Year 6 age groups. Pupils attending an Infant school that is federated with its partner Junior school must still apply for a place at the Junior school for Year 3 onwards.

Late applications

Late applications are any applications which are received after 11.59pm on the National Closing Date. Late applications will not be considered in the first round of allocations unless North Somerset Council considers there are extenuating reasons for allowing them to be accepted as On Time, and the application was received before North Somerset Council has sent details of applications to other Councils. Late applications will not receive an outcome on the National Offer Day. To see the dates we run further allocation rounds, please see the [important dates](#) section.

Local collaborative trusts

A Governor led partnership model which allows schools to work formally together on a wide range of activities as decided by the school Governing Bodies and coordinated through a trust board. The arrangement does not change the existing admissions arrangements for any school in the partnership.

National Offer Day

The day each year on which Local Authorities are required to send the offer of a school place. For Primary pupils offers are sent out by the home Local Authority on 17 April 2023.

Ofsted

This is the abbreviated name of the Office for Standards in Education, which is the Government Department responsible for inspecting and producing inspection reports on schools.

On Time application

Complete applications received before 11.59pm on the National Closing Date. These will be considered in the first round of allocations and receive an outcome on the National Offer Day.

Oversubscription Criteria

The Oversubscription Criteria is used to determine which children will be given places if there are more applications than places available at the school.

Oversubscribed schools

These are schools where the number of applications exceeds the number of places available.

Own Admission Authority schools

This is the collective term used within this guide for all schools responsible for their own Admissions Arrangements such as Academies, Free Schools and Voluntary Aided Schools. All reference to 'Own Admission Authority schools' within this guide therefore includes all these schools.

Parent

This includes anyone, including carers, who have parental responsibility for a child as set out in the Children Act 1989. All references in this Parents' Guide therefore include carers.

Parental Responsibility

[Parental responsibility](#) is defined under the Children Act 1989 as being all the rights, duties, powers, responsibilities and authority which, by law, a parent of a child has.

Primary schools

Primary schools cover the Reception to Year 6 age groups. Some Infant and Primary schools also provide Nursery education.

Undersubscribed schools

These are schools where there are fewer applications than the number of places available.

Voluntary Aided (VA) schools

Responsibility for management is shared between the Council and Church, but with the Church playing a greater role. The Governing Body is the Admissions Authority and its Oversubscription Criteria may be different from those used by a Council. The Governing Body is responsible for allocating school places although they may delegate the function to the Council.

Voluntary Controlled (VC) schools

Whilst responsibility for management is shared between the Council and the Church of England or the Durban Trust, the Council is the Admissions Authority and is responsible for determining the admissions arrangements and allocating school places.
