## Allocation Sheet for Clevedon School

### National Offer Day (1 March 2023)

Clevedon School has a Published Admission Number of 240.

404 preferences have been received for the school. It has, therefore been necessary to use the oversubscription criteria, as outlined below, to determine which of the applicants should be offered the places available.

The 240 available places have been offered to the following applicants:
