Two-Side Guide

What happens during a SEN Graduated Response?



Your school will ask you and your parents or carers about what things you are finding difficult at school or college. Together you, your parent carers and teacher will 'plan' how everyone at school will work with you and support you.



During the term you will have the extra support from school to do the things you planned together. We want you to enjoy learning and to feel safe. Your teacher will be available at any time if you have questions.



At the end of the term the school will ask to meet with you and your parents or carers to discuss and review the plan to see if it has worked. You will be able to share your thoughts about how the term went for you. You will have the chance to talk about doing the same things if they are working well for you or to try some different things, particularly if things are much better now.



If you or your parent or carer feel that something has been missed or that you don't understand something then you can share that with the school or other professionals.
