## NORTH SOMERSET COUNCIL

# (VARIOUS ROADS, BACKWELL, PORTISHEAD, CLEVEDON, NORTH SOMERSET) (PROHIBITION OF MOTOR VEHICLES) (SCHOOL STREETS) ORDER 2023

North Somerset Council in exercise of its powers under sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as 'the Act of 1984') as amended and Traffic Management Order 2004 as amended and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby makes the following order:-

 This order shall come into operation on the XXX and may be cited as the North Somerset Council (Various Roads, Backwell, Portishead, Clevedon North Somerset) (Prohibition of Motor Vehicles) (School Streets) Order 2023.

#### 2. In this order:-

"goods" includes money and postal packages of any description;

"money" includes a cheque, banknote or postal order or money order;

"public service vehicles" shall have the same meaning as in Schedule 1(1)(a) of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981;

"school bus" has the meaning assigned to it by Section 1(2) of the School Bus (Safety) Bill 2008-2009;

"pedal cycle" shall have the same meaning as that defined in the TSRGD;

"vehicle" unless the context otherwise requires, shall mean a vehicle of any description and shall include a machine or implement of any kind, either drawn or propelled along roads whether or not by mechanical power.

- 3. Save as provided in Article 4, Article 5 and Article 6 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed along the lengths of road specified in the Schedules to this order and at the times stated in the Schedules.
- Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a pedal cycle to enter or proceed in the length of road referred to in the Schedules.
- 5. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle, to enter or proceed in the length of road referred to in that Article to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely-
  - (a) for or in connection with the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any premise situated on or adjacent to the length of road specified in the Schedules of this order:

- (b) for the purpose of agricultural in connection with land adjacent to or with access from the lengths of road specified in the Schedules of this Order or for the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon that land;
- (c) in connection with carrying out on or in premises situated on or adjacent to the lengths of road specified in the Schedules of this Order any of the following operations:
  - i. building, industrial or demolition operation;
  - ii. the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
  - iii. the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the length of road or the sides of roads specified in the Schedule to this Order;
  - iv. the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the said lengths or road or sides of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984.
- (d) any scheduled local bus service.
- (e) any security company armoured vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting money.
- (f) to proceed to or from premises which are situated on or adjacent to any of the length of road specified in the Schedules of this Order and at which the vehicle is to be garaged, serviced, repaired or re-fuelled.
- (g) in the service of a Local Authority, the Environment Agency, a water undertaker or sewerage undertaken in pursuance of statutory powers or duties and cannot be conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road;
- the vehicle of a universal service provider (as defined in Section 4(3) and
   of the Postal Services Act 2000) to be used for the purpose of delivering and/or collecting mail;
- (i) for fire brigade, ambulance or police in the connection of their duties
- 6. Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit vehicles to enter the lengths of road specified in the Schedules in order to gain access to residential properties or vehicular access to School premises.
- 7. Nothing in Article 3 shall apply to:
  - i. the school bus
  - ii. a public service vehicle

Monday – Friday 08.15 – 09.15 and 14.45 – 15.45

(except for pedal cycles)

Tudor Road – the entire length Norfolk Road – the entire length Forester Road – the entire length Cotswold Close – the entire length Richmond Close – the entire length Halletts Way – the entire length
