

## **Allocation sheet for St Katherine's School**

Transfer to secondary school 2024/25 bulk intake

## National Offer Day (1 March 2024)

The school has a Published Admission Number (PAN) of 180. In order to meet as many on time parental preferences as possible, the school has agreed to breach it's PAN by 8, taking the total intake to 188.

490 preferences have been received for the school. It has, therefore been necessary to use the oversubscription criteria, as outlined below, to determine which of the applicants should be offered the places available.


The places have been offered to the following applicants:

The distance between home and school for the last child offered a place was 3.688 miles, as measured in a direct line.

Any applicants not offered a place at the school have been refused because there were more applications received than places available at the school. The oversubscription criteria was applied to determine who qualifies for a place.





To admit any further children would cause prejudice to the provision of efficient education or efficient use of resources, as set out in the School Admissions Code 2021.

## <u>10 May</u>

The oversubscription criteria was not required as there were more spaces available than applicants who had applied.
