Non-recyclable waste

Fortnightly collection

Only one bin per property.

Your black bin lid should close and no side waste will be collected.

Reduce your waste as much as possible to save money and protect the environment.

Your collections

- Place containers on the kerbside of your property by
 6.30am on collection day. Collect containers once
 emptied as soon as possible.
- Put your house name or number on your containers.
- Report a missed collection within 24 hours at: www.n-somerset.gov.uk/missedcollection

Recycling centres

- Take excess recycling, waste and household bulky items to your nearest recycling centre.
- Separate waste before visiting and recycle all you can. Staff may ask for proof of residency such as a driving licence.
- Some items are chargeable, including waste from home improvements, tyres and hazardous waste such as asbestos. Payment by card.
- Check for advice and opening times before you visit: www.n-somerset.gov.uk/recyclingcentres

Large household items and bulky waste

- Includes mattresses and furniture.
- Call 01934 888 802 to arrange a separate bulky waste collection.
- Chargeable service run by Changing Lives.

Electrical items and batteries

Anything with a plug, battery or cable can be recycled.

Remove batteries where possible and recycle separately. Batteries should be placed in a clear bag in your recycling box.

Putting electrical items and batteries in your black bin is a waste of valuable metals and can cause bin fires.

- Bag all small electrical items and place on top of your box for collection.
- Electrical items larger than a toaster should be taken to a recycling centre.

This leaflet forms the requirements issued to residents under Section 46 of the Environmental Protection Act (1990). If you present recycling and waste in a way that breaches these requirements, your waste and recycling may not being collected. Further enforcement action includes the issuing of fixed penalty notices (£80).
