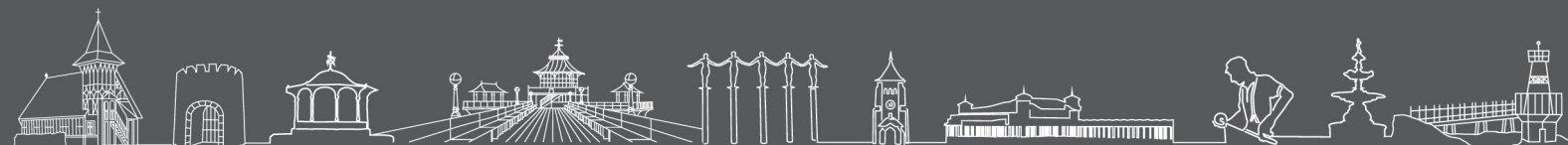
The school has a Published Admission Number (PAN) of 60.

119 preferences have been received for the school. It has, therefore been necessary to use the oversubscription criteria, as outlined below, to determine which of the applicants should be offered the places available.

The distance between home and school for the last child offered a place was 0.757 miles, as measured in a direct line.

Any applicants not offered a place at the school have been refused because there were more applications received than places available at the school. The oversubscription criteria was applied to determine who qualifies for a place.

The law limits the size of an infant class (reception and years 1 and 2) to a maximum of 30 pupils per teacher, admitting any further children would breach this legal limit. Any appeals for the school are therefore 'infant class size appeals'.
