At Royal Oak House, BS1 4GB. Spaces are very limited but having guests join us would be great. Book a place to join us <u>HERE</u>.


September 2024

Neurodiversity (Autism & ADHD) Transformation Project Update

The transformation project was created to co-ordinate the review of the Autism and ADHD Pathways and is led by the ICB and co-chaired by the three Parent Carer Forums (PCF) across Bristol, North Somerset and South Gloucestershire (BNSSG) who have been working with the three local authorities, professionals across health, education, social care, and voluntary sectors, to ensure the voices of parent carers and children and young people inform the future model.

We are providing a project update specifically for our parent carers to ensure they are fully informed about the status of the project, and to provide an opportunity for questions.

Partnership for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools (PINS)

The PINS project is a National initiative funded by the DFE and led by NHS England which will test a new model for supporting good outcomes in mainstream primary schools for Neurodiverse students and to strengthen parent carer and school partnerships.

PINS will bring health and education specialists and expert parent carers into mainstream primary settings to: help shape whole school SEND provision, provide early interventions at a school level, upskill school staff & support strengthening of partnerships between schools and parent carers. Do you see me? Will you work with me?

We'd like to showcase Daniel James, our first Supported Intern, who works in the SEND team at North Somerset.

What's a supported internship?

It's for 16-24 year olds with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) to gain experience, develop skills, and help them move into sustainable paid employment.

What new skills have you learnt on your internship?

I feel my communication skills have developed, and I have more confidence. My ability to pull out key pieces of information has grown since attending a weekly panel and recording decisions. I have a natural aptitude for retaining information, and the amount I've retained since learning my new role has been fantastic. This means I learn from my experiences.

What have you enjoyed doing?

One of my biggest achievements is inputting new cases on to the SEND Portal. This involves contacting parents via email. I learnt the process quickly and feel very comfortable carrying out this task. I have become an independent worker, successfully working in the office without support on a few occasions and also working from home.

How has the team supported you?

I feel that the SEND Team has supported me by:

- showing me how things are done so that I can memorise the instructions and giving me written instructions which I then adapt to suit me
- arranging break times to have a routine that works for me

 giving me a fixed desk after a short period of hot desking so I know where I will be when in the office.

When working from home, the team makes regular pre-agreed check-ins and makes sure I know who to contact if I need help. In the early days, my job coach was very supportive and added value to the role by enabling the team to discover what adjustments might need to be made.

What are the benefits for the team of a supported intern?

Dan's manager, Dawn Hedges says: "Dan is a valued member of the team and is a wonderful example of how a Supported Internship can be successful. Dan carries out meaningful work which has helped with relieving some pressure from a very busy team. I felt extremely proud of Dan when he went back to visit his old school to talk about his experiences with the Supported Internship programme. He hoped to inspire others to reach their full potential and fulfil their ambitions."

New Resource Base at Locking Primary

Treetops Resource Base pupils at Locking Primary School can enjoy brand new facilities, following completion of a two-classroom building that can accommodate up to ten children with Moderate Learning Difficulties (MLD).

The new building is another step forward for SEND provision in North Somerset, offering a specialist intervention programme within a mainstream school, providing the children with a bespoke environment where they can access additional support and learning tailored to their needs.

North Somerset Council delivered the new building in partnership with Locking Primary School & ELAN, Chris Goodsall Architects and Wernicks Buildings Ltd. The project was constructed using modern modular building techniques, undertaking most of the construction off-site to help avoid disruption to the school day.




Family time passes

Booking process

- 1. Choose a place to visit.
- 2. Choose a date when you'd like to go.
- 3. Email: **SENDCAS@n-somerset.gov.uk** with your request.
- 4. We will check our calendar for pass availability.
- 5. SENDCAS will confirm your booking by email.

Important information

- Passes are available for families who have registered their young person with additional needs on the North Somerset Disabled Children's Register (DCR). To register please visit: www.n-somerset.gov.uk/dcr.
- Passes are available on a first come, first served basis. Please note you may not get your first choice.
- Please allow 10 working days to process your request.
- The venue may ask you to show proof of carer status.
- We can only offer one pass per week to a family of a child with additional needs.
- Please check access arrangements directly with the venue before arrival.









SEND and You provides the statutory Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Information, Advice and Support Service (SENDIASS) in South Gloucestershire, Bristol and North Somerset.

Our role is to help parents carers, children, and young people build their knowledge, understanding, and confidence in SEND procedures, policies, practices, and law. We work to enable people to communicate their own needs, wishes, aims, and rights. This means people playing an active and informed role in making decisions about their education, health and social care.

SAY SENDIAS service is free, confidential, impartial, and independent from the local authority and health services. We work with professionals, organisations and services in delivering our function as a SENDIAS service with a team of trained practitioners, based on and within the legal SEND framework.
