The school has a Published Admission Number (PAN) of 210.


415 preferences have been received for the school. It has, therefore been necessary to use the oversubscription criteria, as outlined below, to determine which of the applicants should be offered the places available.

The places have been offered to the following applicants:

EHCP's	Number of offers
Where a school is named in a child's Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP), the admission authority is legally required to admit the child to the school. Therefore, such children are allocated places before the admissions criteria is applied.	15

	Admissions criteria	Number of offers
1	Looked-after children at the time of application and children who were previously looked after but ceased to be so because they were adopted (or became subject to a child arrangements order or special guardianship order) immediately following having been in Care.	4
2	Children, who at the time of application, have a sibling attending Nailsea School, including the 6th form.	79
3	Children living in Nailsea School's Catchment Area.	70
4	Children of Nailsea School staff employed on a permanent contract for at least two years at the time of application, or where the member of staff has been recruited to fill a post for which there is a demonstrable skill shortage. This does not include staff who work on the school site for other employers.	0
5	Children not in the above categories.	42

Within each criterion, priority is given to children living closest to the school as measured in a direct line.



The last child offered a place in this round is in criterion 5 at a distance of 6.291 miles, as measured in a straight line.

Any applicants not offered a place at the school have been refused because there were more applications received than places available at the school. The oversubscription criteria was applied to determine who qualifies for a place.

To admit any further children would cause prejudice to the provision of efficient education or efficient use of resources, as set out in the School Admissions Code 2021.
